During the fifty years of Japanese rule, the face of Taipei changed dramatically. The colonial rulers quickly began to develop the area that was within the city walls. These were demolished in 1900 because they were inconsistent with the plans for an impressive modern city. Also, like many important buildings and temples that were destroyed in the old city, the walls were a stark reminder of the Ch' ing dynasty that Japan had defeated in the war of 1895. Japanese architects designed several magnificent buildings, many of which are still in use today. The distinctly European style of the architecture shows the strong influence that western ideas had on the designers and the scale and grandeur of the buildings suggest that Japan intended to rule Taiwan permanently.

The Presidential Office, National Taiwan Museum, Taipei Guesthouse and the old National Taiwan University Hospital are just a few of the fine buildings constructed between 1895 and 1945. A good road network and parks were also important to the city planners. New Park, now known as the 228 Peace Park, was actually established in 1908, before most of the buildings mentioned above were constructed. The Japanese influence on the development of Taipei as modern city is unmistakable.
